



- We're the largest global network of states and regions committed to achieving net zero emissions by 2050 at the latest.
- Today, the Coalition represents 178 individual states, regions, provinces and subnational governments along with several other national and subnational entities: a total of more than 270 actors, totalling more than 50% of global GDP.

Under2 Coalition member contribution structure

Fair contribution for all

- Based on direction from the cochairs and steering group, the secretariat has developed a contribution structure based on principles of transparency, equity and inclusiveness.
- Membership contribution levels are closely calibrated to members' varying means. The structure reduces financial barriers to participation and provides opportunity for all states to access the full benefits of Under? Coalition membership on a fair basis.
- The contribution structure helps to maximize member ownership and impact and provide resources to enhance member experience.
- A fair contribution structure is central to our ability to work together as a global movement to achieve the Under2 Coalition's vision of halving carbon emissions by 2030 and achieving net zero by 2050.

• The contribution structure includes a discounted offering for associations and/or subnational groups joining the Under2 Coalition. This structure allows a number of regions to participate while paying a single yearly contribution. This is intended to bring greater efficiency to the joining process and eliminate the need for individual regions to contribute separately.
